SUMMERVILLE UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT CITIZENS' BOND OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE BYLAWS

Section 1. <u>Committee Established.</u> The Summerville Union High School District (the "District") was successful at the election conducted on November 6, 2012 (the "Election"), in obtaining authorization from the District's voters to issue up to \$8,000,000 aggregate principal amount of the District's general obligation bonds, pursuant to a 55% vote. The election was conducted under Proposition 39, being chaptered as the Strict Accountability in Local School Construction Bonds Act of 2000, at Section 15264 et seq. of the Education Code of the State of California ("Prop 39"). Pursuant to Section 15278 of the Education Code, the District is now obligated to establish the Oversight Committee to satisfy the accountability requirements of Prop 39. The Board of Education of the Summerville Union High School District (the "Board") hereby establishes the Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee (the "Committee") which shall have the duties and rights set forth in these Bylaws. The Committee does not have independent legal capacity from the District.

Section 2. Purposes. The purposes of the Committee are set forth in Prop 39, and these Bylaws are specifically made subject to the applicable provisions of Prop 39 as to the duties and rights of the Committee. The Committee shall be deemed to be subject to the *Ralph M. Brown Public Meetings Act* of the State of California and shall conduct its meetings in accordance with the provisions thereof. The District shall provide necessary administrative support at District expense to the Committee as consistent with the Committee's purposes as set forth in Prop 39.

The proceeds of general obligation bonds issued pursuant to the Election are hereinafter referred to as "bond proceeds." The Committee shall confine itself specifically to bond proceeds generated under the ballot measure. Regular and deferred maintenance projects and all monies generated under other sources shall fall outside the scope of the Committee review.

- **Section 3.** Duties. To carry out its stated purposes, the Committee shall perform the following duties:
- 3.1 <u>Inform the Public</u>. The Committee shall inform the public concerning the District's expenditures of bond proceeds.
- 3.2 <u>Review Expenditures</u>. The Committee may review quarterly expenditure reports produced by the District to ensure that (a) bond proceeds are expended only for the purposes set forth in the ballot measure; (b) no bond proceeds are used for any teacher or administrative salaries or other operating expenses.
- 3.3 <u>Annual Report</u>. The Committee shall present to the Board, in public session, an annual written report which shall include the following:
 - (a) A statement indicating whether the District is in compliance with the requirements of Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3) of the California Constitution; and
 - (b) A summary of the Committee's proceedings and activities for the preceding year.

- 3.4 <u>Duties of the Board/Superintendent</u>. Either the Board or the Superintendent, as the Board shall determine, shall have the following powers reserved to it, and the Committee shall have no jurisdiction over the following types of activities:
 - (i) Approval of construction contracts,
 - (ii) Approval of construction change orders,
 - (iii) Appropriation of construction funds,
 - (iv) Handling of all legal matters,
 - (v) Approval of construction plans and schedules,
 - (vi) Approval of Deferred Maintenance Plan, and
 - (vii) Approval of the sale of bonds.
- 3.5 <u>Voter-Approved Projects Only</u>. In recognition of the fact that the Committee is charged with overseeing the expenditure of bond proceeds, the District has not charged the Committee with responsibility for:
 - (a) Projects financed through the State of California, developer fees, redevelopment tax increment, certificates of participation, lease/revenue bonds, the general fund or the sale of surplus property without bond proceeds shall be outside the authority of the Committee.
 - (b) The establishment of priorities and order of construction for the bond projects shall be made by the Board in its sole discretion.
 - (c) The selection of architects, engineers, soil engineers, construction managers, project managers, CEQA consultants and such other professional service firms as are required to complete the project based on District criteria established by the Board in its sole discretion.
 - (d) The approval of the design for each project including exterior materials, paint color, interior finishes, site plan and construction methods (modular vs. permanent) by the Board in its sole discretion and shall report to the Committee on any cost saving techniques considered or adopted by the Board.
 - (e) The selection of independent audit firm(s), performance audit consultants and such other consultants as are necessary to support the activities of the Committee.
 - (f) The approval of an annual budget for the Committee that is sufficient to carry activities set forth in Prop 39 and included herein.
 - (g) The adoption of a plan for publicizing the activities of the Committee and the determination as to whether a mailer, a newspaper notice or website materials would best suit the distribution of the Committee's findings and recommendations.

- (h) The amendment or modification of the Bylaws for the Committee as provided herein, subject to the legal requirements of Prop 39.
- (i) The appointment or reappointment of qualified applicants to serve on the Committee, subject to legal limitations, and based on criteria adopted in the Board's sole discretion as part of carrying out its functions under Prop 39.

Section 4. <u>Authorized Activities</u>.

- 4.1 In order to perform the duties set forth in Section 3.0, the Committee may engage in the following authorized activities:
 - (a) Receive and review copies of the District's annual independent performance audit and annual independent financial audit, required by Article XIIA of the California Constitution.
 - (b) Inspect school facilities and grounds for which bond proceeds have been or will be expended, in accordance with any access procedure established by the District's Superintendent.
 - (c) Review copies of deferred maintenance proposal or plans developed by the District.
 - (d) Review efforts by the District to maximize bond proceeds by implementing various cost-saving measures.

Section 5. Membership.

- 5.1 <u>Number</u>. The Committee shall consist of a minimum of seven (7) members appointed by the Board of Trustees from a list of candidates submitting written applications, and based on criteria established by Prop 39, to wit:
 - One (1) member active in a business organization representing the business community located in the District.
 - One (1) member active in a senior citizen's organization.
 - One (1) member active in a bona-fide taxpayers association.
 - One (1) member shall be a parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the District.
 - One (1) member shall be both a parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the district and active in a parent-teacher organization or school site council.
 - Two (2) members of the community at-large appointed by the Board.

5.2 Qualification Standards.

- (a) To be a qualified person, he or she must be at least 18 years of age, in accordance with Government Code Section 1020.
- (b) The Committee may not include any employee, official of the District or any vendor, contractor or consultant of the District.
- 5.3 Ethics: Conflicts of Interest. By accepting appointment to the Committee, each member agrees to comply with Articles 4 (commencing with Section 1090) and 4.7 (commencing with Section 1125) of Division 4 of Title 1 of the Government Code. Additionally, each member shall comply with the Committee Ethics Policy attached as "Attachment A" to these Bylaws.
- 5.4 <u>Term.</u> Except as otherwise provided herein, each member shall serve a term of two (2) years, beginning March 13, 2013. No member may serve more than three (3) consecutive terms. At the Committee's first meeting, members will draw lots to select a minimum of two (2) members to serve for an initial one (1) year term and the remaining members for an initial two (2) year term.
- 5.5 <u>Appointment</u>. Members of the Committee shall be appointed by the Board through the following process: (a) appropriate local groups will be solicited for applications; (b) the Superintendent or his designee will review the applications; (c) the Superintendent or his designee will make recommendations to the Board.
- 5.6 <u>Removal; Vacancy</u>. The Board may remove any Committee member for any reason, including failure to attend two (2) consecutive Committee meetings without reasonable excuse or for failure to comply with the Committee Ethics Policy. Upon a member's removal, his or her seat shall be declared vacant. The Board, in accordance with the established appointment process shall fill any vacancies on the Committee.
- 5.7 <u>Compensation</u>. The Committee members shall not be compensated for their services.
- 5.8 <u>Authority of Members</u>. (a) Committee members shall not have the authority to direct staff of the District. (b) Individual members of the Committee retain the right to address the Board as an individual.

Section 6. Meetings of the Committee.

- 6.1 <u>Regular Meetings</u>. The Committee is required to meet at least once a year including an annual organizational meeting to be held in the District.
 - 6.2 Location. All meetings shall be held within the District.
- 6.3 <u>Procedures</u>. All meetings shall be open to the public in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act, Government Code Section 54950 et seq. Meetings shall be conducted according to such additional procedural rules as the Committee may adopt. A majority of the number of Committee members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business except adjournment.

Section 7. District Support.

- 7.1 The District shall provide to the Committee necessary technical and administrative assistance as follows:
 - (a) preparation of and posting of public notices as required by the *Ralph M. Brown Act*, ensuring that all notices to the public are provided in the same manner as notices regarding meetings of the District Board;
 - (b) provision of a meeting room, including any necessary audio/visual equipment;
 - (c) preparation and copies of any documentary meeting materials, such as agendas and reports; and
 - (d) retention of all Committee records, and providing public access to such records on an Internet website maintained by the District.
- 7.2 District staff and/or District consultants shall attend all Committee proceedings in order to report on the status of projects and the expenditures of bond proceeds.
 - 7.3 No bond proceeds shall be used to provide District support to the Committee.
- **Section 8.** Reports. In addition to the Annual Report required in Section 3.2, the Committee may report to the Board at least semi-annually in order to advise the Board on the activities of the Committee. Such report shall be in writing and shall summarize the proceedings and activities conducted by the Committee.
- **Section 9.** Officers. The Superintendent shall appoint the initial Chair. Thereafter, the Committee shall elect a Chair and a Vice-Chair who shall act as Chair only when the Chair is absent, which positions shall continue for two (2) year terms. No person shall serve as Chair for more than two (2) consecutive terms.
- **Section 10.** <u>Amendment of Bylaws</u>. Any amendment to these Bylaws shall be approved by a two-thirds vote of the entire Board.
- **Section 11.** <u>Termination</u>. The Committee shall automatically terminate and disband at the earlier of the date when (a) all bond proceeds are spent, or (b) all projects funded by bond proceeds are completed.

CITIZENS' BOND OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE ETHICS POLICY STATEMENT

This following Ethics Policy Statement provides general guidelines for Committee members to perform their roles. Not all ethical issues that Committee members face are covered in this Statement. However, this Statement captures some of the critical areas that help define ethical and professional conduct for Committee members. The provisions of this Statement were developed from existing laws, rules, policies and procedures as well as from concepts that define generally accepted good business practices. Committee members are expected to strictly adhere to the provisions of this Ethics Policy.

POLICY

- CONFLICT OF INTEREST. A Committee member shall not make or influence a District decision related to: (1) any contract funded by bond proceeds or (2) any construction project which will benefit the committee member's outside employment, business, or a personal finance or benefit an immediate family member, such as a spouse, child or parent.
- OUTSIDE EMPLOYMENT. A Committee member shall not use his or her authority over a particular matter to negotiate future employment with any person or organization that relates to: (1) any contract funded by bond proceeds, or (2) any construction project. A Committee member shall not make or influence a District decision related to any construction project involving the interest of a person with whom the member has an agreement concerning current or future employment, or remuneration of any kind. For a period of two (2) years after leaving the Committee, a former Committee member may not represent any person or organization for compensation in connection with any matter pending before the District that, as a Committee member, he or she participated in personally and substantially. Specifically, for a period of two (2) years after leaving the Committee, a former Committee member and the companies and businesses for which the member works shall be prohibited from contracting with the District with respect to: (1) bidding on projects funded by the bond proceeds; and (2) any construction project.
- COMMITMENT TO UPHOLD LAW. A Committee member shall uphold the federal and California Constitutions, the laws and regulations of the United States and the State of California (particularly the Education Code) and all other applicable government entities, and the policies, procedures, rules and regulations of the Summerville Union High School District;
- COMMITMENT TO DISTRICT. A Committee member shall place the interest of the District above any personal or business interest of the member.

The undersigned acknowledges he or she has received a copy of this Ethics Policy Statement, understands the provisions of this policy and agrees to adhere to its requirements.

Measure "H" Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee: Composition, Role and Functions

The legal obligation for Summerville Union High School District to select and appoint participants to serve on a Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee ("Committee") resides in the California Education Code. The following Education Code citations/excerpts are here presented as they clearly define the composition, role and functions of this Committee.

Proposition 39

Proposition 39, approved by the California voters in November, 2000, provides that the Governing Board of a school district may pursue the authorization and issuance of general obligation bonds by 55 percent vote of the electorate. As a result of the passage of Proposition 39, language was added to the Education Code requiring school districts passing a bond extension designated as a Proposition 39 bond (like Measure "H") to establish a Citizens' Oversight Committee to actively review and report on uses of the bond proceeds to ensure that they are spent only on school facilities improvements allowed under each bond measure and not for any other purpose.

Obligation to Appoint the Committee

The governing board is required to establish and appoint an independent citizens' oversight committee within 60 days of the date that the governing board enters on its minutes the election results, pursuant to Section 15274. [Education Code Section 15278(a)]

Role of the Committee

The Oversight Committee shall consist of at least seven (7) members to serve for a term of two (2) years without compensation and for no more than two (2) consecutive terms.

The Oversight Committee must include:

- One member who is active in a business organization representing the business community located within the school district;
- One member active in a senior citizens' organization;
- One member who is the parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the school district;
- One member who is both a parent or guardian of a child enrolled in the school district and active in a parent-teacher organization; and
- One member who is active in a bona fide taxpayers' organization.

[Education Code Section 15282(b)]

The Committee may not include any employee or official of the school district or any vendor, contractor or consultant of the school district. [Education Code Section 15282(b)] Nor can the Board appoint persons who hold an office incompatible with service on the Committee pursuant to Government Code section 1125 et seq. [Education Code Section 15282(b)]

Purpose and Activities of the Committee

The purpose of the Committee shall be to inform the public concerning the expenditure of the bond proceeds. The Committee shall engage in the following activities to carry out this purpose:

- Actively review and report on the proper expenditure of taxpayers' money for school construction;
- Advise the public as to whether the school district is in compliance with the requirements of Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3) of the California Constitution; and
- Convene to provide oversight for, but not limited to:
 - > Ensuring that bond revenues are expended only for the construction, reconstruction, rehabilitation or replacement of school facilities, or the acquisition or lease of real property for school facilities;
 - ➤ Ensuring that no funds are used for any teacher or administrative salaries or other school operating expenses. [Education Code Section 15278(b)

It is the express intent of the Legislature that the members of the Committee "promptly alert the public to any waste or improper expenditure of school construction bond money." [Education Code Section 15264]

The Committee is authorized to engage in any of the following activities in furtherance of its purpose:

- Receive and review copies of the annual independent performance audit required by Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3)(C) of the California Constitution;
- Inspect school facilities and grounds to ensure bond revenues are expended in compliance with Article XIIIA, Section 1(b)(3) of the California Constitution;
- Receive and review copies of any deferred maintenance proposals or plans developed by the school district; and
- Review efforts by the school district to maximize bond revenues by implementing cost saving measures, including but not limited to:
 - > Mechanisms designed to reduce the cost of professional fees;
 - Mechanisms designed to reduce the cost of site preparation;

- > Recommendations regarding the joint use of core facilities;
- > Mechanisms designed to reduce costs by incorporating efficiencies in school site design; and
- ➤ Recommendations regarding the use of cost-effective and efficient reusable plans. [Education Code Section 15278]

The Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee must at least annually issue regular annual reports of the result of its activities. [Education Code Section 15280(b)]

Board of Education Support of the Committee

The governing board shall provide the Committee with (a) any necessary technical assistance and administrative assistance in furtherance of the Committee's purpose and (b) sufficient resources to publicize the conclusions of the Committee. No bond funds may be used to pay any of these expenses. [Education Code Section 15280(a)]

Meetings of and Documents Provided to the Committee

All Committee meetings shall be open to the public and shall be subject to the provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act. All documents received by the Committee and reports issues by the Committee shall be a matter of public record and be made available on an Internet website maintained by the governing board of the school district. [Education Code 15280(b)]

The Summerville Union High School District Measure H Bond Oversight Committee will meet at least quarterly. All meetings will be duly posted and will be open to the public.

The Citizens' Bond Oversight Committee will not perform certain functions such as:

- The Committee has no authority to participate in the school district's actual bond sale and issuance process, or make decisions regarding the timing, terms and structure of a bond issuance.
- The Committee does not have authority to select, or participate, in the negotiation or bid process for contractors or consultants for bond projects.

Dear Tonya:

We are pleased to confirm our understanding of the services we are to provide Summerville Union High School District with respect to the District's "Measure H" general obligation bonds for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013.

In accordance with the reporting requirements of Proposition 39, we will perform a financial audit to ensure that Summerville Union High School District properly accounts for the proceeds from the sale of the "Measure H" bonds until all of those proceeds have been expended. We will also perform a performance audit to ensure that the "Measure H" bond proceeds have been expended only for the specific projects listed in the ballot measure.

The scope of our audits for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013 will be limited to the following:

- Perform a financial audit of the "Measure H" bond activities for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013, in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America, and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.
- Perform a performance audit of the "Measure H" bond activities for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013, in accordance with standards applicable to performance audits contained in Government Auditing Standards, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States.
- Verify that bond proceeds and project expenditures are accounted for in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles.
- Prepare a summary "Measure H" Balance Sheet as of June 30, 2013.
- Prepare a summary "Measure H" Statement of Revenues, Expenditures, and Changes in Fund Balance - Budget and Actual for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013.
- Audit payments to vendors and contractors to ensure timely payment in accordance with required payment schedules.
- > Review and evaluate whether bond funds were expended for allowable costs under State law.
- Review and evaluate whether bond funds were expended in accordance with District and State guidelines for bidding and procurement.
- Review and evaluate whether there are proper tracking systems in place to easily monitor the expenditure of funds by project.

- Review and evaluate whether the District actions are consistent with assertions presented in the ballot measure.
- Make recommendations that will help to improve the District bond program, if applicable.
- Verify that all bond proceeds are deposited into the appropriate bond trustee accounts, and/or District funds.
- Verify that bond funds are spent only for projects identified on the ballot measure.
- Verify that no bond funds are used to pay for any teacher or administrative salaries, or other school operating expenditures.
- Express an Independent Auditor's Opinion on whether or not the "Measure H" funds are being spent as intended by the bond measure and/or as mandated by state law.

Our audits will include such tests and procedures as we consider necessary to complete the engagements. We do not contemplate a detailed examination of all transactions. We will, however, inform you promptly if any such matter comes to our attention.

Fees for these services, exclusive of meetings with the Citizen's Oversight Committee, will not exceed \$2,900 for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2013. An additional fee may be charged for attending meetings with the Citizen's Oversight Committee, if deemed appropriate. All fees charged will be based on the actual number of hours worked multiplied by our standard billing rates for governmental audits. We will make every effort to coordinate the bond audits with the audit of the District to keep audit costs to a minimum.

Our fees are based upon audit requirements currently in effect. If State audit requirements change and additional services are required, we may propose an adjustment to future fees, if deemed appropriate.

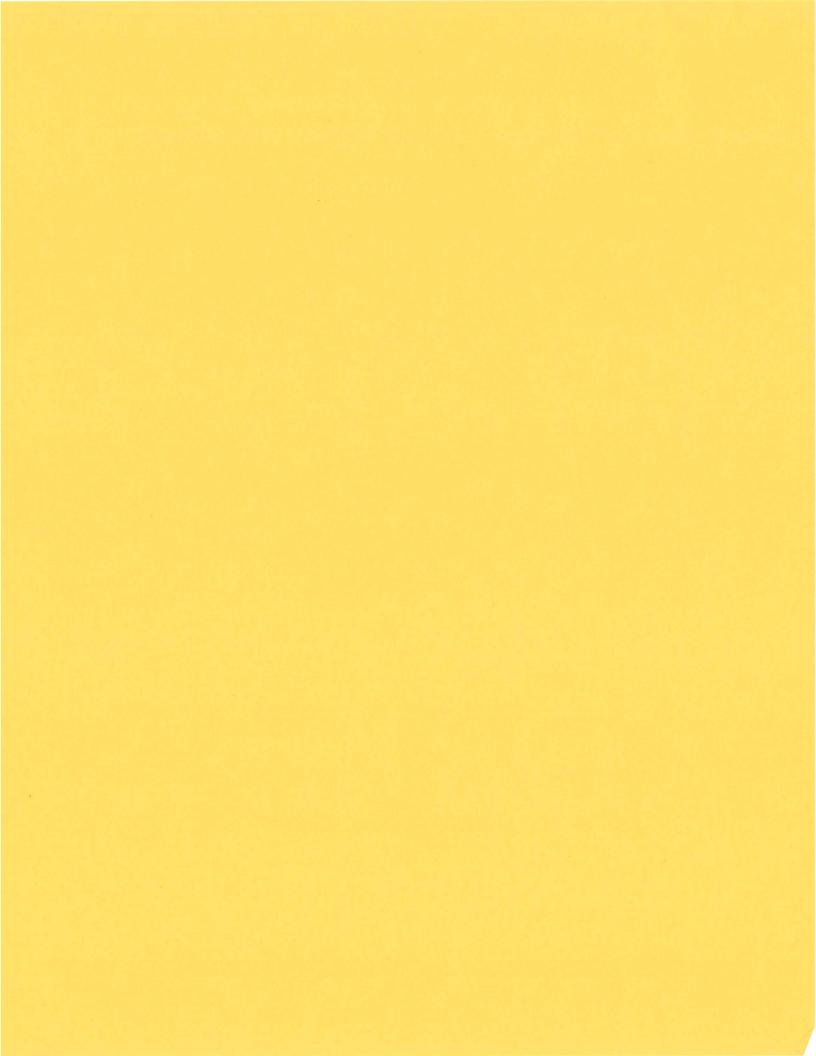
